**Course Description:**

The history of Turkish Republic and its modernization process will be discussed in this course. The Turkish Republican history will be examined through a historical perspective. The main themes of the course will be determined by the Turkish Republican socio-political, cultural, and economic progresses and modifications in the 20th and early 21st centuries. This course will be focused on Turkish Republican advancements through a holistic perspective from political history to art history.

**The Learning Outcomes:** On successful completion of this course, students will be able to point out:

- Learning key themes in the 19<sup>th</sup> century Turkish history
- Learning Turkish Republican socio-political and cultural progresses and modifications
- Understanding the effects of these progresses and modifications on the Turkish society
- Understanding Turkish Republican intellectual and cultural life
- Discussing the Cold War Period and its importance in the European political history
- Contextualizing fundamental concepts and central questions about the 20<sup>th</sup> century Turkish history
- Gaining proficiency in the use of critical thinking skills in history
- Expressing knowledge and proficiency in speaking about central issues in the Turkish Republican history

**Course Moddle:** The course's moodle is your location for readings, the course syllabus, announcements and practical information regarding writing assignments and grading criteria.

**Grading Breakdown:**

The academic assessment of this course will be divided into four parts:

**Final Exam** (35%), the date will be announced by the university before the final exam weeks; confirm date and time via university web page. This will be a 2-hour "in class" exam. It will involve essay questions, term and picture questions. The topics in the final exam will cover the whole semester.

**Mid-Term Exam** (25%), **12 April** (Week 8, on Monday). This will be a 1-hour "in class" exam. It will involve essay question, term and picture questions. The Mid-Term Exam will cover the topics that been taught until 06 April 2020.

**Analytical Paper** (30%), due in class **17 May (Week 13, on Monday)**. Each student with group members will be required to submit one written paper. This paper should be minimum 5 and maximum 10 pages in length. The topic of the written paper will be discussed in class. For a detailed description of the proper format for analytical paper, students should consult the Glasgow University booklet about writing essays and papers, named “Writing with Style: Preparing Essays, Papers and Dissertations in History, Economic & Social History”. It will be loaded in Moodle. The analytical papers will be loaded to Turnitin by one member of the group.

**Attendance and participation** (10%), Students must attend at least 75% of the course, that is, you will be permitted up to 10 absences out of 42 total teaching hours for this semester. Anyone who has over 10 absences without presenting a medical note will automatically be awarded an F as the final grade.

The midterm and the final examination must be taken on the date specified on this syllabus. **Make-up examinations** will be given after the scheduled examination time only for **a valid medical reason**. Any student who misses the final examination for a valid medical reason must notify the professor prior to or immediately after the examination in order to receive an “Incomplete” grade and arrange for a makeup examination.
