Dissertation Abstract

"The Possibilities of Paul Ricoeur Philosophy in the Context of the Ethical Predicaments of Journalism Practices"

By problematizing current ethical ideals and the dominant perspective of journalism in the context of otherness, this study suggests a different ethical perspective influenced by Paul Ricoeur and Richard Kearney, arguing that hospitality is an obligation for more ethical journalism. Ricoeur's emphasis on ethical social institutions, transfiguring past, sharing stories and welcoming otherness, which invite differences and hospitality, render his philosophy worthy for journalism ethics. However, Ricoeur does not distinguish between provocative and well-intentioned narratives and thus, this study proposes a methodology to discern between such narratives: Kearney's diacritical hermeneutics. It is a bridge between the other and us, and has five applications to journalism routines, making them hospitable and welcoming the voice of the other.
